RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Entry forms and fees should be deposited in the box at Walnut Tree Stores, Llangynidr, or sent to the Show Treasurer at the address shown on page 2, or email your entry form to GardenShowLlangynidr@gmail.com by **8pm Wednesday 21 August**. (Entry forms are also available to download from www.llangynidrshow.org, click on 'Garden Show'). Cheques should be made payable to Llangynidr Garden Society. If entering by email, payment should be made when setting up on the day of the show.
2. **Exhibits to be staged between 8am and 10am** on the day of the show. The hall will be closed for judging. **Show opens by 1.30pm and closes at 4pm** with the announcing of raffle prize winners. **Exhibits may be removed between 4.15pm and 5pm.**
3. Class entry cards should be collected from the 'Entries' stand in the hall after 8am.
4. Exhibitors are to provide their own white paper plates, vases, etc, to display their exhibits.
5. **An entrant may enter only 2 exhibits per class in any section.**
6. All exhibits in the flower, fruit and vegetable sections must have been grown in the garden or allotment of the exhibitor, except pot plants, which should have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least 2 months.
7. Craft items and pictures must have been created during the past year. If possible, pictures (class ??) should be displayed on stands or mini easels.
8. The committee accepts no responsibility for the safe custody of any exhibit.
9. Points awarded will be 3, 2, 1 for 1st, 2nd, 3rd prizes respectively, except where otherwise stated.
10. Objections must be made in writing and given to the Show Secretary before 3pm on the day of the show, together with a deposit of £1, which will be refunded if the objection is upheld. The judge's decision is final.
11. Prize money should be collected from the Treasurer in the hall. Any uncollected money will be returned to Garden Show funds.
12. All cups previously awarded must be returned in a clean condition to the Cup Secretary, Show Secretary, or any member of the committee when notified.
13. Any child attending the Garden Show should be accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult.

LLANGYNIDR GARDEN SOCIETY : DATA PRIVACY POLICY : ANNUAL SHOW 2019

When you enter a class in the Llangynidr Garden Society Annual Show (the “LGS Show”) you give us some personal information. This usually includes your name and address, phone and email contact details. It might also include information about your children. Any cheque you give us includes your bank details, although we do not record that information but pay the cheque straight into the Society’s bank account. You may also give us this information in other circumstances, such as when you attend any other event organised by Llangynidr Garden Society or ask to receive information about our activities.

The Garden Society must keep all such information safe and secure and may use it only for the legitimate interests and activities of the Society.

Those interests and activities include but are not limited to: the organisation and operation of the LGS Show and communications about it; the establishment and maintenance of appropriate records, including as to entries and payments received and cups and other prizes won; promotional activities including the publication of the names and home locations (town or village but not detailed addresses or other contact details) of cup and prize winners on the LGS Show website (associated with the Llangynidr Agricultural Show website); the taking of photographs of people (including children) and exhibits both general and specific and use of such photographs (which may be edited or altered) in promotional activities about the LGS Show including on its website. Many photographs will be of groups of people without any caption or other means of identifying individuals. While we do not need to ask you to complete a general data privacy consent form, we nonetheless recognise that some people may be unwilling to appear, or have their children appear, in photographs on a website or other publicity in which individuals can be identified. Please indicate on your entry form if this is not acceptable.

Your information is maintained and used only by Garden Society Committee Members and others assisting in the organisation and running of the Show. The information is actively maintained as long as the Garden Society needs it to enable the efficient organisation of the LGS Show including for the collection of cups and prizes at the end of the relevant year, and for other relevant activities of the Society. Names of winners remain on the LGS Show website for several years. Information provided on entry forms is not automatically deleted and may be used to verify whether, for example, a person had entered a particular class in a previous year (where this might be relevant to classes which that person may enter this year). Information may therefore remain in the Garden Society’s control until the Society ceases to exist or until you ask for any information about you or your family to be deleted. We do not share your information with any other organisation.

You may ask to see what information we hold about you or your children, to amend the information or to have it deleted. You can talk to any member of the Garden Show Committee about this. Committee members’ contact details are at the front of the LGS Show programme.

If you are unhappy about the way we store or use your personal data and you cannot resolve the issue with the Garden Society, you can apply for help to the office of the Information Commissioner (ico.org.uk)






Made to the following recipe:

175g brown sugar	100g sultanas
175ml sunflower oil	3 large eggs
140g grated carrot	grated zest of 1 large orange
175g self raising flour	1tsp bicarbonate of soda
ground cinnamon and grated nutmeg to taste	

The mixture will be quite sloppy! 40-60 mins at 180C/fan160C/gas 4

Leave plain or make simple icing with icing sugar and orange juice


